## **Support by Austrian NGOs and other private organizations after the North-East Japan Earthquake**

**Austrian Red Cross** made the following donations to the Japanese Red Cross:

400.000 Euro on 9 May  
1.000.000 Euro on 31 May  
4980 Euro on 17 June  
140.000 Euro on 4 July  
21.478 Euro on 22 August  
50.000 Euro on 9 September  
1.000.000 Euro on 26 September

**Caritas Austria:** Participation with 1.85 million Euro in construction of new children's home in Ichinoseki (Iwate) which was destroyed by the earthquake/tsunami (summer 2011).

Donations by a number of **Austrian companies** (implementing agency: "Hilfswerk Austria") for a project intended to (re-)build a community centre in Minamisoma/Fukushima (end 2011).

Cooperation between architects/engineers of the **Technical University Vienna** (TU Wien) and Tokyo University with a view to working out suggestions for sustainable ways and methods of reconstruction in Tohoku (to that effect workshop organized in Vienna in July of 2011 with representatives from Tokyo University dedicated to the topic "disaster management").

**Austrian Airlines:** Donation and distribution of 330 CD players to evacuation centre in Tohoku region (August 2011)
