

1. The Hon'ble Prime Minister of Bangladesh expressed deep condolence and solidarity with the Japanese people, who are greatly devastated by the great earthquake and the tsunami that has caused huge loss of lives and massive destruction of property.
2. The Cabinet and Members of the Parliament of Bangladesh adopted motion of resolution expressing deep condolence, while expressing willingness to be by the side of Japan at the time of their great disaster.
3. The Government of Bangladesh dispatched a Bangladesh Air Force transport aircraft with relief materials containing blankets, rubber gloves and rubber boots for the affected people.
4. The Embassy of Bangladesh expressed deep condolence and observed a one-minute silence on March 17 to show respect to the victims of the earthquake and tsunami, which was published in The Japan Times on 25 March 2011.
5. The Embassy of Bangladesh donated Yen 100,000 as proceeds from one day's salary of the Embassy officials for the victims of Tohoku disaster. The cheque was hand over to the Japan Red Cross.
6. The Hon'ble Prime Minister of Bangladesh donated US \$ 2 million to the Japan Red Cross to support rehabilitation and reconstruction work.

7. The Expatriates from Bangladesh in collaboration with Bangladesh Embassy organised a charity concert and donated to the tune of ¥ 520000 to the Japan Red Cross from its Charity proceeds.

8. The Bangladesh Embassy also made visits to the Tohoku region and rescued our 55 expatriates living there.

9. The Bangladesh community members, under their individual as well as organizational initiatives, visited the affected area from time to time and distributed baby food, essential items and hot meals.

10. A Bangladeshi restaurant owner offered his hotel as shelter for displaced people from the Tohoku region.
